## What is Ag in the Classroom?

NYAITC offers programs, workshops, classroom visits, and instruction resources through a network of local Cornell Cooperative Extension educators, Farm Bureau volunteers, teachers, and others to help New Yorkers:

- ◆ Appreciate the economic, social, historical, and scientific importance of agriculture in our society
- ◆ Develop an accurate picture of today's agriculture
- ◆ Explore the many career opportunities in all areas of agriculture
- ◆ Recognize the connection between agriculture production and the daily consumption of food and fiber products

With special focus on elementary grades, we help teachers integrate knowledge about agriculture and the food & fiber system into the curriculum and address NYS learning standards, to provide relevant learning experiences across the curriculum that enhance student achievement and bring learning to life.

## What is Food, Land, & People?

Food, Land & People's science and social sciences-based curriculum currently serves Pre-K to 12 grade students throughout the United States. The curriculum consists of 55 hands-on lessons, developed and tested by more than a thousand educators and has been aligned to NYS Learning Standards.

The subjects range from environmental science and stewardship to human populations and land use issues. 20 of the lessons are available in Spanish. FLP's mission is to develop citizens literate about the relationships between agriculture, the environment and human populations.
