Identifying Charter Donors

Charter donors are key to the success of the initial capital campaign to establish a community foundation. Charter donors are those that demonstrate a commitment to improving the community and set an example for others to participate.

The Advisory Board Members must identify and invite major businesses and individuals of financial means to make pledges to generate all or a portion of the first \$50,000 of the \$100,000 needed to establish a Community Fund.

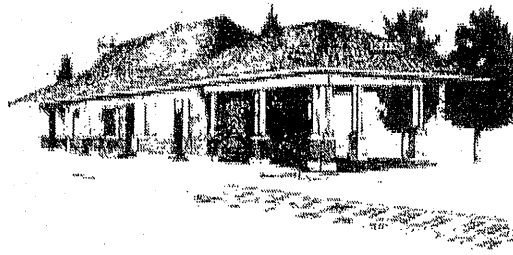
