Donna Conley is the CEO of Ohio Citizen Advocates for Chemical Dependency Prevention and Treatment, a position she has held since 2001. Prior to this, she was the executive director of the Ohio Credentialing Board. Conley was the executive director for five years of a community alcohol and other drug prevention coalition and also has more than 20 years experience as an administrator in Ohio's child welfare system at both the county and state levels.

She has a bachelor's degree in sociology from Wayne State University in Detroit and a master's in business administration from Franklin University. She is an Ohio Licensed Social Worker, an Ohio Certified Prevention Specialist II and the recipient of a 2001 ADAPAO Prevention Award for Excellence in Public and Organizational Policy. She was also a 2001-2002 fellow at the John Glenn Institute of Public Policy Leadership Academy for Emerging Leaders in Behavioral Health Care.

Conley has received awards from the Ohio Council of Behavioral Healthcare Providers and the Summit County Community Drug Board, and the Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services Board of Cuyahoga County for her advocacy work. She also serves on the national board of Faces & Voices of Recovery headquartered in Washington, D.C.
